Barium study is a highly effective diagnostic tool. A contrast medium is frequently used with avian patients to identify the course and size of the gastrointestinal (GI) tract divisions and to identify obstructions, masses, and foreign bodies. As it flows through the digestive tract you can check the appearance of the tract and see if there are obstructions, tumors, thickenings, foreign bodies or other abnormalities.

In addition, if there are abnormalities in the internal organs, such as enlargements, they may displace the position of the intestinal tract or stomach giving a clue to what may be occurring internally.

This green wing macaw came in with a history of swollowing a feeding tube. A series of x rays were shot post barium to pin point the position of the tube as on normal x ray it was not visible. We were able to pin point that the tune had settled in the ventriculus.







The amur falcon is a migratory bird with one of the longest migratory routes of all birds, it covers a distance of up to 22000 km per year. In India while returning to africa it follows the route from northeast to central india and Maharashtra to Africa. The interesting fact about this bird is that most of its route is over the Arabian sea. During the recent cyclone Tauktae this bird probably lost his was due to the strong winds at sea and was found on the coastal area in Mumbai.

Bird shooting in Lebanon



Shot Honey Buzzard

Lebanon is one of the most important migration areas for millions of birds breeding in Europe. Almost all songbird species fly over the Middle East, as do storks and many birds of prey.

The large-bird migration is particularly concentrated between Mediterranean in the west and Syrian desert in the east. Based on the data, evidence and video documentation collected so far by CABS and our Lebanese partners, it is estimated that millions of birds are shot in Lebanon every year, including hundreds of thousands of birds of prey and storks. T

he situation with the lesser spotted eagle is especially dramatic. Censuses have shown that virtually the entire world population of the lesser spotted eagle flies over Lebanon twice a year.

he main hotspots of illegal hunting are the mountain regions, where the migration of birds is enormously concentrated on so-called "bottlenecks" and where massacres take place on strong migration days. Many of the shot birds are shot to be eaten. Rarer species such as vultures or eagles are also sold alive at markets - provided they survive the shooting - or are stuffed by taxidermists and sold in hunting shops.

During our bird protection camps and Internet research, we attach a great emphasis to our our work against illegal killing of birds of prey and other large birds such as storks. Given their slower reproduction rates and smaller populations, the conservation impact of illegal hunting is having a more rapid negative effect on these species. Even though almost all songbirds have the same legal protection status as birds of prey or storks, the authorities have limited resources and have so far only intervened in the illegal hunting of large species, rather than in songbird poaching.

If weather allows, groups can enter our large macaw aviary with opportunities to take photos and hold birds. Our guided tours last approximately two hours. Please bring sunscreen, bug spray, and comfortable walking shoes.

Also feel free to bring unsalted nuts to feed the birds, however, no peanuts as they cause diseases in birds. For safety purposes, please stay on the trail and with your tour guide at all times. If you need to leave early, please advise your tour guide. All guided tours begin promptly 15 minutes after the scheduled time. Our gates open 15 minutes before tours and close 15 minutes after, allowing a 30-minute window for all visitors to arrive. Once the gate closes and the tour begins, late visitors will not be allowed in. Please check our address prior to your scheduled tour to ensure enough time for travel.

We do not charge a fee for our educational tours, but donations are greatly appreciated and go along way to help our charity keep the birds happy and healthy.

Psittacine Beak and Feather Disease

Today (17 June) I was chatting with Ernie Colaizzi of Research Associates Lab in Allen, Texas. He mentioned the very high incidences of PBFD (Psittacine Beak and Feather Disease) that he has been seeing in laboratory results this year in the USA.

The problem is also experienced elsewhere; I received no fewer than two messages daily from Pakistan this year relating to this problem. This disease has no cure. It must be excluded from a collection and if present must be eradicated. This is achieved through testing of birds to identify infected individuals, their removal from the collection and then performing environmental swabs, which require no blood.

Positive environmental swabs will require extensive cleaning and disinfections. Destruction of the nest, perches and other porous surfaces is also required.

Enrichment


Enrichment is very important. It allows the animals to play out natural behaviors. In this case these cockatoos are destroying coconuts, which they encounter in the wild; I have seen many species in Indonesia drink coconut water snd chew a hole on the side for the flesh.

Safari West Nonprofit veterinary dentists visit Safari West!



Learn about the team of veterinary dentists that visited Safari West to provide dental care for our male Patas Monkey Maurice, as well as a few other animals!

One of the many things I have learned from our veterinarian, Dr. Emily Cehrs, is that good veterinary practices include proactive care as well as reactive care. Animals can be very good at hiding discomfort, as showing weakness in the wild could make them a target for predators. But, when a problem is caught earlier, treatment is often easier and more successful.

So, how can animal care staff catch any potential issues as early as possible? One way is through careful observations by our caregivers, who assess the health of each individual every day, and are trained to notice small differences in an animal's behavior. Our tour guides also spend enough time around the animals here that they may notice something and notify our animal department. But, even with all of this visual observation, some issues do not outwardly present themselves in an obvious way.

The same is true for humans—this is why it is recommended to go to the doctor for a general health check every once and a while! Dr. Cehrs takes the same proactive approach with the animals at Safari West, administering preventative health exams as often as once a year for as many animals as possible. These health exams can include x-rays, ultrasounds, blood work, and anything else needed to make sure each animal is in good health. I also learned a fun new word that is used to describe this preventative care: "prophylaxis"!

At the beginning of July, Dr. Cehrs performed a preventative health exam on our adult male patas monkey, Maurice. Along with all of the standard health checks, which Maurice passed with flying colors, a dental exam and cleaning was performed.



Meyer's Parrots

The Meyer's Parrot is a small stocky parrot that is one of the smallest parrots in the genus Poicephalus. Also, sometimes called the Brown Parrot, they are the only African parrot with extensive blue-green underparts, and a blue rump with grey head, neck and wings. They have variable yellow markings on the head, bend of the wing and underwing coverts and legs.

They have a large range in central, eastern and Southern Africa. They occur in lowland forests, dry savanna, and secondary growth, avoiding humid forests. Diet of wild birds is fruit, nuts and seeds. Wild birds are generally found in pairs or small groups, sometimes near urban areas.

On 13 September last, the Capitol in Washington became the nerve centre of the fight for the defence of biodiversity at an event in which Global Humane recognised the value of the work of a scientist who has dedicated his life to working for the defence of biodiversity: Theo Pagel.

This award, beyond being a public recognition by the independent association, is a transcendent moment in the fight for the defence of biodiversity, as Wolfgang Kiessling stated in his inaugural speech. In addition to the 80,000 euro prize money, which will be used for new projects to save species, it is a wake-up call from the US capital to all authorities and committed people on the planet.



There seems to be a fair amount of confusion within the fancy, regarding the breeding of quality Budgerigars. I think this has come about because there is so much contradictory information passed on to the fancy. Most of the techniques tried by fanciers do not give the results they were expecting. This is because the providers of the information are generally very experienced breeders, who are giving information about their own birds and experiences. This is fine, only they are in possession of better quality birds than most of us. I have no doubt their information is correct, but it is only relevant to their own birds and as such can't be considered a generalization.


Therefore, what is successful for them would have a very different result if they were working with lesser quality or even a different line of birds. So what works for them will not necessarily work in our aviaries. Thus we need to formulate our own strategy with which we can work, to breed better quality from whatever birds are in our present possession.

Another important thing we must do when seriously trying to improve our birds, is to be very sceptical regarding the information passed onto the fancy in the way of miracle pairings. I'm sure your aware of the ones I mean, like flecked headed birds carry the feather you want, or use large dirty opalines to improve spot, put spangle into everything they will only do good and increase fertility at the same time. Some fanciers in Australia have become so paranoid regarding the shape of the wings on a bird, they have become oblivious to the rest of the bird.

How do you recognize well-fed young Hyacinth macaws?

It is well known that the quality and composition of the diet for young birds affect the condition of their feathers, skin and beak. This can be seen particularly well in young hyacinth macaws. Poorly and unbalanced nourished young Hyacinth macaws have blackish, dull plumage and pale, sometimes almost whitish skin around the eyes and the lower beak.

The young Hyacinth macaw pictured here is approximately 7 months old and not fully weaned. It has bright blue and shiny plumage and perfect toe skin without hyperkeratosis. Its skin around the eyes is an intense yellow color.

Both Hyacinth macaws can be exported in special transport boxes according to the IATA regulations accompanied with CITES export permit, veterinary health certificate and negative test results for avian influenza and Newcastle disease.

I travel a lot to visit our customers and their parrots to check and treat them at their homes. The specialized veterinary video consultations for parrots and parakeets we offer help a lot to get a first impression about the birds and their situation as well as the bird owners problems.

Some cases like nutritional issues can be already solved during the video consultation. However, most cases require thorough diagnostic and therapeutic measures, which I carry out in my veterinary practice limited to parrots at Graefelfing, Germany or as part of my home visits at the customer's location.

In summary:

Appendix I includes species threatened with extinction. Trade in specimens of these species is permitted only in exceptional circumstances.

Appendix II includes species not necessarily threatened with extinction, but in which trade must be controlled in order to avoid utilization incompatible with their survival.

Appendix III This Appendix contains species that are protected in at least one country.



Seabird Conservation

Seabirds (and waterfowl) are the only animals that have conquered the sea, land and sky. Over twenty species of seabirds live in the Caribbean, and many more visit every year.

Seabirds spend most of their lives on or over the sea, foraging, feeding or resting. They are highly adapted to this unique way of life. Many have webbed feet (to help them swim and dive), waterproofed feathers (to keep them warm and afloat), salt glands (that allow them to excrete the salt from the seawater they drink), and acute vision, a strong sense of smell and sharp bills (to help them find and catch food). Their long wings support them while travelling over the oceans in search of food and, on land, living in colonies helps to protect them from predators.

Before humans lived in the Caribbean (~7,000 years ago), the islands supported vast numbers of seabirds. On many islands, there were so many that their droppings (called guano) formed piles hundreds of feet high, and were mined for fertilizer. Today, tropical seabirds, like those in other areas of the world, are threatened by human activities. In fact, seabirds are now one of the most threatened groups of birds in the world. Many colonies are declining in size and some have disappeared.

On land, introduced rats, cats and dogs prey on eggs, chicks and even adults. In some parts of the Caribbean, humans still take eggs, chicks and adults for food and aphrodisiacs. Coastal development and sea level rise destroy and damage nesting habitat. Even the oceans are no longer safe. Seabirds often feed around fishing boats, and are caught and die in fishing gear. Overfishing, pollution and climate change have depleted their food sources. Hungry seabirds mistake floating plastic for food and fill their bellies with trash. Heavy metals from marine pollution also accumulate in their bodies.

Caribbean seabirds have much to teach us about the health of the seas around our islands. We need to understand their ecology, so we can protect them, their habitats, and the marine resource on which we all depend. Unfortunately, there have been only a few studies on seabirds in the Caribbean. This is partly because of the many practical difficulties in studying them, but they are also less attractive to funders than accessible land birds and migrants, and other mobile marine animals like sharks and turtles.

For most seabirds, the Caribbean is one large connected habitat. Therefore, it is important for scientists and conservationists across the region to work together to understand the big picture. This was first recognized in 1998, when we formed the Caribbean Seabird Working Group. Healthy seabird populations are possible in the Caribbean, but we must all work together to understand, manage and protect them.



One of our rescues earlier today was this healthy female Spotted Eagle Owl that had found herself trapped inside Cedar Square Shopping Centre in Fourways.


We posted her rescue video and subsequently many have asked how is it possible to catch a healthy owl so easily, she must be sick. Tell you what, if you practice catching owls for 40 years, I promise you'll start getting pretty good at it.

The only thing that was wrong with her is that she had a couple of tail feathers missing, but otherwise 100% healthy and good for release straight back into her territory outside.

We've fielded 38 rescue calls today and have done 22 rescues so far, with the help of our volunteers. Yesterday's count was 26 rescue calls and 17 rescues. It's our busy season, and busy we are.

I won't bore you with the details of what it costs to rescue over 300 patients a month. But, it's a ton of money.


